

How does the appeal process work?

When you file your notice of appeal (also called a NOA), the Clerk of the Court will assign your case a number – known as a docket number. The six-digit number will be different from your VA claim file number, your military service number and your Social Security number.

How do I use that docket number to keep track of my case?

All of the docket information is available on the Court's website at uscourts.cavc.gov. Click on the "Docket Search" button on the left hand side of the menu. Enter in your docket (case) number and click "Search". This will take you to the Court's docket for your case. Finally, click on the docket number of your case for your information.

If the Pro Bono Program evaluates my case, what will happen?

Once you return the required forms, we will review the forms and then (if you qualify) we will file an appearance on your case and screen your file in detail. If it is determined after this full review that we cannot find an issue in your case, our attorney team will let you know by letter, but they will still be available to answer questions about your case on our **Helpline**.



What is the Veterans Consortium Pro Bono Program?

The Pro Bono Program was created by the U.S. Congress in 1992 to assist veterans or their family members with their appeal before the Court.
